



ViewPOINT CASI* questionnaires designed for use by Young People and Professionals in Wales

This document provides brief descriptions of Viewpoint CASI questionnaires primarily or exclusively designed for young people and professionals in Wales. This includes information on which young people the questionnaires are designed for and the organisations that led the design process.

All questionnaires can be accessed online, in Welsh as well as English, using the speech engine designed by the University of Wales, Bangor.

Where appropriate, data from these questionnaires can be reported on against the Seven Core Aims as well as other relevant measures.

Survey questionnaires are completed anonymously by young people – often through a website link - but providing information about their profile e.g. their age, gender, ethnicity, levels of ability, geographical location, school year, preferred first language to assist analysis and reporting.

Self Assessment questionnaires are completed by named young people so that they can be used to inform planning and decision-making related to each individual. However, the Viewpoint software also enables aggregate reporting for research or evaluation purposes where required.

Extended Entitlements survey

Two age-related interactive questionnaires for young people [11-13 yrs and 14 yrs plus] surveying young people's views on their awareness of their ten extended entitlements and their perceptions of to what degree these are being met. The questionnaire covers areas such as education; participation; involvement in activities; and information, advice and support.

Early Years entitlements survey

An extensive interactive questionnaire surveying young children's [7 to 11 year olds] views on their rights and the awareness of their early entitlements. The questionnaire covers areas such as different ways of learning, time to play, having a good start in life, being healthy, safety, and being listened to.

Bullying questionnaire [revised for Welsh Schools] survey

Interactive age-appropriate survey questionnaires for primary and secondary pupils that surveys their experiences of bullying, awareness of bullying happening in the school, if they have ever bullied anyone, and the response of teachers and the school to bullying.

This is an enhanced version [ensuring greater manageability] of the bullying questionnaire used in many authorities in England.

Illegal Drugs Misuse survey

An interactive survey questionnaire for secondary school pupils that asks them questions about their perception of substance misuse education, and about their attitudes, experiences and behaviours relating to illegal drugs and solvents. This questionnaire is also designed to produce 'distance travelled' reports that show changes in young people's views and experiences over time.

Alcohol Misuse survey

An interactive survey questionnaire designed for secondary schools pupils and those outside mainstream education [including those receiving *Youth Access* services] that asks young people their experiences and perceptions of how alcohol can affect their health and actions. This can also produce 'distance travelled' reports.

Lead designers – Children and Young Person's Framework Partnership consortium and Torfaen Health Promotion and Community Safety Partnerships.

Local Communities for Young People survey

A brief interactive questionnaire designed for use by young people [11 yrs and above] that asks them about their feelings, ideas, opinions and perceptions of the area in which they live.

Lead designers – Children and Young Person's Framework Partnership consortium and Carmarthenshire Youth Service.

Family Circle self assessment

An interactive questionnaire for children and young people to complete in preparation for their Family Circle meeting. The questionnaire covers areas such as where they are living, getting on with family members, school, contact with the police and safety and helps with assessing the needs of each young person.

Lead designers - Cardiff Family Circle Project providing Family Group Conference services.

LAC Review self assessment

A revised questionnaire for looked after young people to use to inform their review and planning process. Revisions relate to reporting requirements placed on Children's Services in Wales to report against the Seven Core Aims.
